

Where is Barcelona?





- Barcelona is capital city of the Catalonia region in Spain. It is Spain's second most populated city, with a population of 1.6 million persons.
- History/Culture: old Roman city, great food, languages spoken: Catalan, Spanish, English
- Modern day: A major center for economic, trade, tourism with impacts on commerce, education, entertainment, media,, science, and the arts. The city has excellent transportation (extensive subway, buses, trains, international airport) and a vibrant (young) atmosphere. The currency is the Euro.





A comprehensive university of ~30,000 students; 60 departments; ~80 B.S. degrees (+ graduate degrees. It is #2 among best global universities in Spain and #160 among all global university rankings by U.S. News and World Report. The campus is located ~20 miles north of Barcelona city center and is easily accessible by frequent, regional train.

Housing: Vila Universitària, the residential hall of the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona, offers accommodation for more than 2000 people. Full kitchen and living areas are available with each room (similar to GT apt-style rooms). Housing is included in the program fee.

Popular dining option includes the Plaça Cívica (student center), a place for cultural and social life at UAB.
